2 Peter 1:5-9 February 7, 2016

2 Peter 1:5, For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; ⁶ and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, <u>perseverance</u>; and to perseverance, godliness; ⁷ and to godliness, <u>mutual affection</u>; and to mutual affection, <u>love</u>. ⁸ For if you possess these qualities in <u>increasing measure</u>, they will keep you from being <u>ineffective</u> and <u>unproductive</u> in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ But whoever does not have them is <u>nearsighted</u> and <u>blind</u>, forgetting that they have been cleansed from their past sins.

1) Faith Doesn't Stand Around With Its Hands In Its Pockets

- The 1st Virtue Of Genuine Faith Is Moral Goodness
- The 2nd Virtue Of Genuine Faith Is Increasing Knowledge
- The 3rd Virtue Of Genuine Faith Is Self-Control
- The 4th Virtue Of Genuine Faith Is **PERSEVERANCE**

<u>**2 Peter 1:5**</u>, For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith ... ⁶...perseverance...

<u>Thought</u>: *Hupomone* is usually translated patience, but patience is too passive a word... *Hupomone* does not simply accept and endure; there is always a forward look in it.

Hebrews 12:1, Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with <u>perseverance</u> the race marked out for us, ² fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before Him He endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

• The 5th Virtue Of Genuine Faith Is **GODLINESS**

<u>2 Peter 1:5</u>, For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith ... ⁶...godliness

Thought: *Eusebeia* literally means to worship well and is an almost untranslatable Greek word. Godliness is "reverence towards the one and only God, and the kind of life that He would wish us to lead." It describes the character of the person who never fails God, man or himself.

<u>1 Timothy 4:7</u>, ...train yourself to be <u>godly</u>. ⁸For physical training is of some value, but <u>godliness</u> has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come.

<u>1 Timothy 6:6</u>, But godliness with contentment is great gain. ⁷For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it... ¹⁰For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs. ¹¹But you, man of God, flee from all this, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness. ¹²Fight the good fight of the faith...

• The 6th Virtue Of Genuine Faith Is **MUTUAL AFFECTION**

<u>2 Peter 1:5</u>, For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith ... ⁷ and to godliness, mutual affection...

<u>Thought</u>: *Philadelphia* means fraternal love or brotherly kindness. In secular Greek literature, *Philadelphia* was used to describe the love family members held towards one another, but in the New Testament it was used to describe the

love that believers possess for one another even though they were members of different natural families.

Romans 12:9, <u>Love</u> must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. ¹⁰Be devoted to one another in <u>love</u>. Honor one another above yourselves. ¹¹ Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. ¹²Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. ¹³Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality.

Galatians 6:9, Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. ¹⁰Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.

2) A Growing Faith Is Productive And UNSELFISH

2 Peter 1:8, For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹But whoever does not have them is nearsighted and blind, forgetting that they have been cleansed from their past sins.

Concluding Reminder: Only one life will soon be past, only what's done for God will last!
