*The Others Who Make Ministry Happen! Colossians 4:6-17* Sermon Series: Clash Of Kingdoms, Pt.10 August 30, 2015

**Colossians 4:6**, Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone. <sup>7</sup>Tychicus will tell you all the news about me. He is a dear brother, a faithful minister and fellow servant in the Lord. <sup>8</sup>I am sending him to you for the express purpose that you may know about our circumstances and that he may encourage your hearts.<sup>9</sup>He is coming with Onesimus, our faithful and dear brother, who is one of you. They will tell you everything that is happening here. <sup>10</sup>My fellow prisoner Aristarchus sends you his greetings, as does Mark, the cousin of Barnabas. (You have received instructions about him; if he comes to you, welcome him.) <sup>11</sup>Jesus, who is called Justus, also sends greetings. These are the only Jews among my co-workers for the kingdom of God, and they have proved a comfort to me. <sup>12</sup>Epaphras, who is one of you and a servant of Christ Jesus, sends greetings. He is always wrestling in prayer for you, that you may stand firm in all the will of God, mature and fully assured. <sup>13</sup>I vouch for him that he is working hard for you and for those at Laodicea and Hierapolis. <sup>14</sup>Our dear friend Luke, the doctor, and Demas send greetings. <sup>15</sup>Give my greetings to the brothers and sisters at Laodicea, and to Nympha and the church in her house. <sup>16</sup>After this letter has been read to you, see that it is also read in the church of the Laodiceans and that you in turn read the letter from Laodicea.

**Ecclesiastes 4:9,** Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their work: <sup>10</sup>If one falls down, his friend can help him up. But pity the man who falls and has no one to help him up!

#### The Others Who Make Ministry Happen:

### 1) Two Were <u>MESSENGERS</u>

<u>Colossians 4:7, Tychicus</u> will tell you all the news about me. He is a dear brother, a faithful minister and fellow servant in the Lord. <sup>8</sup>I am sending him to you for the express purpose that you may know about our circumstances and that he may encourage your hearts. <sup>9</sup>He is coming with <u>Onesimus</u>, our faithful and dear brother, who is one of you. They will tell you everything that is happening here.

#### One Had A <u>STEADFAST HEART</u>

<u>1 Corinthians 16:3</u>, Then, when I arrive, I will give letters of introduction to the men you approve and send them with your gift to Jerusalem. <sup>4</sup>If it seems advisable for me to go also, they will accompany me. (Acts 20:7; Ephesians 6:21-22; Titus 3:12; 2 Timothy 4:12)

### One Had A <u>SINFUL PAST</u>

**Philemon 1:17,** So if you consider me a partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. <sup>18</sup>If he has done you any wrong or owes you anything, charge it to me. <sup>19</sup>I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand. I will pay it back—not to mention that you owe me your very self. <sup>20</sup>I do wish, brother, that I may have some benefit from you in the Lord; refresh my heart in Christ. <sup>21</sup>Confident of your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I ask.

#### 2) Three Were <u>COMFORTERS</u>

<u>Colossians 4:10</u>, *My fellow prisoner* <u>Aristarchus</u> sends you his greetings, as does <u>Mark</u>, the cousin of Barnabas. (You have received instructions about him; if he comes to you, welcome him.) <sup>11</sup>Jesus, who is called Justus, also sends greetings. These are the only Jews among my co-workers for the kingdom of God, and they have proved a comfort to me.

### • One Had A <u>COURAGEOUS HEART</u>

Acts 19:29, Soon the whole city was in an uproar. The people seized Gaius and Aristarchus, Paul's traveling companions from Macedonia, and rushed as one man into the theater. (Acts 20:4, 27:2)

• One Gets Very <u>LITTLE ATTENTION</u>

**One Had A PREVIOUS FAILURE** <u>Acts13:13</u>, ...Paul and his companions sailed to Perga...where John left them to return to Jerusalem. <u>Acts 15:37</u>, Barnabas wanted to take John, also called Mark. <sup>38</sup>but Paul did not think it wise to take him, because he had deserted them and had not continued with them in the work. <sup>39</sup>They had such a sharp disagreement that they parted company. Barnabas took Mark and sailed for Cyprus, <sup>40</sup>but Paul chose Silas and left, commended by the brothers... <sup>41</sup>He went through Syria and Cilicia, strengthening the churches. (2 Timothy 4:11)

# 3) The Other <u>OTHERS</u>

<u>Colossians 4:12</u>, Epaphras, who is one of you and a servant of Christ Jesus, sends greetings. He is always wrestling in prayer for you, that you may stand firm in all the will of God, mature and fully assured. <sup>13</sup>I vouch for him that he is working hard for you and for those at Laodicea and Hierapolis. <sup>14</sup>Our dear friend <u>Luke</u>, the doctor, and <u>Demas</u> send greetings.

<sup>15</sup>Give my greetings to the brothers and sisters at Laodicea, and to <u>Nympha</u> and the church in her house. <sup>16</sup>After this letter has been read to you, see that it is also read in the church of the Laodiceans and that you in turn read the letter from Laodicea. <sup>17</sup>Tell <u>Archippus</u>: "See to it that you complete the ministry you have received in the Lord."

- One Had A Strong Commitment To <u>PRAYER</u> <u>AND WORK</u>
- One Was <u>INCREDIBLY GIFTED</u> (Acts 16:10, 20:5, 27:1; 2 Timothy 4:11)

## • One <u>LATER STRAYED</u>

**<u>2 Timothy 4:9</u>**, Do your best to come to me quickly, <sup>10</sup> for Demas, because he loved this world, has deserted me...<sup>11</sup> Only Luke is with me. Get Mark and bring him with you, because he is helpful to me in my ministry.

• One Opened <u>THEIR HOUSE</u>

<u>Acts 2:46</u>, Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, <sup>47</sup>praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

# **Paul's Conclusion:**

<u>Colossians 4:17</u>, "See to it that you complete the ministry you have received in the Lord."

## **Putting This Passage Into Practice:**

• We are all called to serve, regardless of talents, gifts, abilities, resources or past, simply stated God has a place for you to serve. Without you doing your part—"the ministry isn't complete!"
