Grace For The Condemned! Faces Of Grace, Pt. 1 John 8:2-11 June 5, 2016

<u>GRACE</u> - God's favor toward those who are unworthy!

John 8:2, At dawn He appeared again in the temple courts, where all the people gathered around Him, and He sat down to teach them. ³The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group ⁴and said to Jesus, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. ⁵In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" ⁶They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing Him. But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with His finger ⁷When they kept on questioning Him, He straightened up and said to them, "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." ⁸Again He stooped down and wrote on the ground. ⁹At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there.¹⁰Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" ¹¹ "No one, sir," she said. "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."

Ephesians 2:8, For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— ⁹<u>not</u> by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

<u>2 Corinthians 5:19</u>, God was reconciling the world to Himself in Christ, <u>not counting people's sins against them</u>. And <u>He has</u>

<u>committed to us the message of reconciliation</u>. ²⁰We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God.

As Christ's Ambassadors, We Must Minister Like Christ:

1) We Must Imitate His WISDOM

John 8:3, The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group ⁴and said to Jesus, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. ⁵In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" ⁶They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing Him. But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with His finger.

Exodus 20:14, You shall not commit adultery.

Leviticus 20:10, If a man commits adultery with another man's wife ... both the adulterer and the adulteress must be put to death.

2) We Must Imitate His WORDS

John 8:7, When they kept on questioning Him, He straightened up and said to them, "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." ⁸Again He stooped down and wrote on the ground. ⁹At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. **Deuteronomy 17:7,** *The hands of the witnesses must be the first in putting him to death...*

3) We Must Imitate His GRACE

John 8:10, Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" ¹¹ "No one, sir," she said. "<u>Then neither do I condemn you</u>…"

• Forgiveness Does Not Imply A License To <u>SIN</u>

Romans 6:1, What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? ²By no means!

<u>Psalm 85:10</u>, Love and faithfulness meet together; righteousness and peace kiss each other.

4) We Must Imitate His MISSION

John 8:11b, ... "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."

When Addressing Someone Caught In Sin, Ask Yourself:

- 1. Am I taking more pleasure in condemnation or restoration?
- 2. Am I being affected by peer pressure?
- 3. Am I saying what Christ would say and acting how Christ would act?
- 4. Am I casting a Christ-like shadow on this situation?
