Legit Faith Prays Elite Level Prayers! Legit Faith: All Day, Everyday! Pt. 7 James 5:13-18 May 15, 2016

James 5:13, Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. ¹⁴Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. ¹⁶Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. ¹⁷Elijah was a human being, even as we are. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years. ¹⁸Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops.

The Theme Of This Passage Is Not Anointing With Oil, Healing Or Confession. It Is About <u>PRAYER</u>!

Four Facets Of Elite Level Prayer:

1. We Should Pray For Comfort And Praise God For <u>BLESSINGS</u>

James 5:13, *Is anyone among you in trouble*? Let them pray. *Is anyone happy*? Let them sing songs of praise.

Philippians 4:6, Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

<u>1 Peter 5:6</u>, Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that He may lift you up in due time. ⁷Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you. ⁸Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. ⁹Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that the family of believers throughout the world is undergoing the same kind of sufferings.

2. We Should Pray For Healing And <u>FORGIVENESS</u>

James 5:14, Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven.

<u>2</u> Corinthians 12:8, Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. ⁹But He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness."

3. We Should Confess Our Sins And Pray With <u>EACH</u> <u>OTHER</u>

James 5:16, Therefore <u>confess your sins to each other and</u> <u>pray for each other</u> so that you may be healed.

Matthew 5:23, "Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother or sister has something against you, ²⁴leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift." (1 John 1:9)

Galatians 6:1, Brothers and sisters, if someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit should restore that person gently. But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted. ²Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. ³If anyone thinks they are something when they are not, they deceive themselves. ⁴Each one should test their own actions. Then they can take pride in themselves alone, without comparing themselves to someone else,

4. We Should Pray With Righteous MOTIVES

James 5:16, ... The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. ¹⁷Elijah was a human being, even as we are. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years. ¹⁸Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops.

James 4:3, When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures.

Matthew 6:9, "This, then, is how you should pray: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name, ¹⁰Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. ¹¹Give us today our daily bread. ¹²And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. ¹³And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.'
