Luke 17:11, Now on His way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. ¹²As He was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met Him. They stood at a distance ¹³and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!" ¹⁴When He saw them, He said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed. ¹⁵One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. ¹⁶He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked Him—and he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? ¹⁸Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹Then He said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."

Thanksgiving Lessons From The Lepers:

1. They Had A Common <u>AFFLICTION</u>

Luke 17:11, Now on His way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. ¹²As He was going into a village, <u>ten men who had leprosy met Him</u>. <u>They</u> <u>stood at a distance</u>... **Leviticus 13:46**, *As long as they have the disease they remain unclean. They must live alone; they must live outside the camp.*

Romans 3:23,...for all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God...

2. They Had A Common NEED

Luke 17:12, As He was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met Him. They stood at a distance ¹³ and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!"

Luke 5:27, After this, Jesus went out and saw a tax collector by the name of Levi sitting at his tax booth. "Follow Me," Jesus said to him, ²⁸and Levi got up, left everything and followed Him. ²⁹Then Levi held a great banquet for Jesus at his house, and a large crowd of tax collectors and others were eating with them. ³⁰But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law who belonged to their sect complained to His disciples, "<u>Why do you</u> <u>eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners</u>?" ³¹Jesus answered them, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. ³²I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to <u>repentance</u>."

3. They Were Given A Simple <u>MESSAGE</u>

Luke 17:14, When He saw them, He said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.

Ephesians 2:1, As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins... ⁴But because of His great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, ⁵made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. ⁶And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with Him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, ⁷in order that in the coming ages He might show the incomparable riches of His grace, expressed in His kindness to us in Christ Jesus. ⁸For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—⁹not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

The One We Want To Be Like:

Luke 17:15, One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. ¹⁶He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked Him—<u>and he was a Samaritan</u>. ¹⁷Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? <u>Where are the other nine</u>? ¹⁸Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹Then He said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."
