What Does The Resurrection Say About Jesus? *The Case For Christ, Pt.3 John 12:12-19; 1 Corinthians 15:2-19 April 9, 2017

Palm Sunday:

John 12:12, The next day the great crowd that had come for the festival heard that Jesus was on His way to Jerusalem. ¹³They took palm branches and went out to meet Him, shouting, "Hosanna!" "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Blessed is the king of Israel!" … ¹⁸Many people, because they had heard that He had performed this sign, went out to meet Him. ¹⁹So the Pharisees said to one another, "See, this is getting us nowhere. Look how the whole world has gone after Him!"

The Resurrection Is What Makes The Gospel Such <u>GOOD</u> <u>NEWS</u>

<u>**1** Corinthians 15:2</u>, *By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain.*

What Are The Basic Facts Of The Resurrection?

Fact #1: Jesus Died By Roman CRUCIFIXION

<u>**1** Corinthians 15:3</u>, For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that <u>Christ died for our sins</u> according to the Scriptures...

Isaiah 53:4, But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on Him, and by His wounds we are healed. ⁶We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

• Reported In All Four Gospels

(Matthew 27; Mark 15; Luke 23; John 19)

• **Reported By Many Non-Christian Sources** Tacitus (Roman historian); The Talmud (a collection of ancient Jewish writings); Lucian (a Greek Satirist); and many other non-Christian sources reported it including Josephus (1st century Roman-Jewish historian who was born in Jerusalem).

"...Pilate, upon hearing Him accused by men of the highest standing amongst us, had condemned Him to be crucified..." (Josephus)

Fact #2: Jesus Was Buried And The Tomb Was EMPTY

<u>**1** Corinthians 15:4</u>, ... that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures...

How Do We Know The Tomb Was Empty?

• <u>EYEWITNESS</u> Testimony Of The Disciples And The Women

Luke 24:9, When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others...¹¹But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. ¹²Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb.

• Enemy <u>CONFIRMATION</u>

<u>Matthew 28:12</u>, When the chief priests had met with the elders and devised a plan, they gave the soldiers a large sum of money, ¹³telling them, "You are to say, 'His disciples came during the night and stole Him away while we were asleep.'"

Conclusion: The tomb was empty and the body was gone!

Facts #3: There Were Many Witnesses To The <u>RESURRECTION</u>!

<u>**1** Corinthians 15:5</u>, ... and that He appeared to <u>Cephas</u>, and then to <u>the Twelve</u>. ⁶After that, <u>He appeared to more than five hundred</u> of the brothers and sisters at the same time, <u>most of whom are</u> <u>still living</u>, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷Then He <u>appeared to</u> <u>James</u>, then to <u>all the apostles</u>, ⁸and last of all <u>He appeared to me</u> <u>also</u>, as to one abnormally born.

• The Previously Fearful Disciples Preached It And Claimed It To The <u>POINT OF DEATH</u>

• James, The Skeptical Brother Of Jesus Became A <u>MARTYR</u>

James, Jesus' brother, was an unbeliever early in Jesus life (Mark 3:21-22, 31-35; 6:3-4; John 7:1-9), but after Jesus' resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:7), James became a leader in the Jerusalem church (Acts 15:12-21; Galatians 1:19), and ultimately died as a martyr for his faith as was confirmed by Josephus and the Talmud.

• Paul The Persecutor Of The Church Was <u>CONVERTED</u>

What Caused Paul to change? Paul spoke of his conversion after encountering a risen Jesus in 1 Corinthians 15:9-10; Galatians 1:13-16; and Philippians 3:6-7.

What Is The Best Explanation Of These Three Facts?

- Jesus <u>ROSE FROM THE DEAD</u>!
 - Rejecting The Resurrection Is Rejecting The <u>EVIDENCE</u>
 <u>1 Corinthians 15:12</u>, But if it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, <u>how can some of you</u> say that there is no resurrection of the dead?

John 11:25, Jesus said "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in Me will live, even though they die; ²⁶ and whoever lives by believing in Me will never die. <u>Do you believe</u> this?"
